

2012 Spectator Guide

If you're looking for some great race viewing options, we suggest the following:



A LAS FLORES & JEFFERSON

Directions: From Interstate 5 north or south exit at La Flores and head west toward Jefferson. Look for parking on adjacent streets. This location is close to the start and finish line.

B THE VILLAGE OF CARLSBAD:

Directions: From Interstate 5 north or south, exit at Carlsbad Village Drive and head west toward the ocean. Look for parking on adjacent streets. The village of Carlsbad offers great race viewing since the full and half marathon courses take runners along Jefferson, Laguna and Carlsbad Blvd. Since this is an out and back course, the participants will pass by these locations twice. The village of Carlsbad offers great restaurants and coffee shops.

C CARLSBAD BLVD. AND CANNON (CANNON PARK):

Directions: From Interstate 5 north or south, exit at Cannon and head west toward the ocean. Look for parking on adjacent streets.

D PALOMAR AIRPORT ROAD & AVENIDA ENCINAS

Directions: From Interstate 5 north or south, exit at Poinsettia and head west toward the ocean. Turn right (north) on Avenida Encinas and park on Avenida Encinas south of Palomar Airport Road. This is a special location, so bring your lawn chairs and coffee thermos because you will enjoy the parade of marathoners passing you three times!

E AVENIDA ENCINAS & CANNON

Directions: From Interstate 5 north or south, exit at Cannon and head west to Avenida Encinas. This is a great spot to greet marathoners just after they pass the halfway point of the course.

F CARLSBAD BLVD. & POINSETTIA AND AVENIDA ENCINAS & CARLSBAD BLVD.

Directions: From Interstate 5 north or south, exit at Poinsettia and head west to Carlsbad Blvd. or turn left off Poinsettia onto Avenida Encinas to Carlsbad Blvd. These locations offer good spectator visibility and the participants can sure use a pick-me-up at this point in the race.

FINISH LINE

An obvious location, but we had to mention it!

Carlsbad Boulevard at Sequoia

Palomar Airport Road at Hidden Valley
